Faculty Association Task Force

Terms of Reference

Purpose

Student faculty associations (FAs) play a key role in both University and Students' Union governance, and are important centers of engagement for their members. In addition to their representative functions, most FAs also offer robust programming and services that serve to provide faculty specific opportunities for student engagement. This task force will create a place for all stakeholders to come together to frankly discuss challenges and risks related to the management and support of FAs, and draft tangible, actionable recommendations that will enhance FA organizational functionality and sustainability.

Scope

The task force will publish a report before November 30, 2012 that will seek to answer the following questions.

- 1. How can we help FAs flourish and enhance the service and representation they provide to the students in their faculties?
- 2. What issues and risks are we seeking to address?
- 3. What solutions can we implement to mitigate these risk factors?
- 4. What would the resource implications be for implementing these recommendations?
- 5. Who would be responsible for providing the resources for implementing these recommendations?
- 6. Where would the responsibility be shared, and how?
- 7. What conversations being had by other bodies (e.g. Alcohol Policy & Review, accreditation bodies) do we need to be mindful of in developing our recommendations?

- 5. Right after the Fall Term/Remembrance Day Break

Hey there Councillors,

Below is a report of my activities over the past two weeks.

I. Nursing Undergraduate Association Probation

The Nursing Undergraduate Association has elected to move on to probation as per SU Bylaw 8100 §20. A motion was made at their General Meeting on March 26, 2012. The Student Governance Advisor and I met with the outgoing and incoming Presidents, and the current Executive of the NUA, and determined that this request was legitimate. The NUA currently has an unclear budgeting process, is in a difficult financial situation, and is facing electoral challenges. Therefore, I determined that probation-level support would be worthwhile. Probation is not a punitive measure, but instead allows for increased communication with and support from the SU. Over the next few weeks we will be drafting a Conditions of Probation, consulting with SGS, the Dean of Students, and the Dean of Nursing, and setting a path forward for the NUA.

II. Undergraduate Research Symposium

The SU has hired Gurpaul Bara to be the Undergraduate Research Symposium Coordinator this year. We're looking ahead to an excellent event that will increase the presence of arts and humanities research, showcase the scholarship of our students, and recruit more students into participating in mentored undergraduate research.

III. Library Budget Pressures

Because of an ever-tightening budget, Cameron Library has proposed to reduce its hours to 7:00 AM – 1:00 AM during non-exam periods, with the exception of the basement. Usage of the library during the late night and early morning hours is limited an average of 5 students per floor. If you or your students have any concerns, please don't hesitate to let me know.

IV. Why Represent?

In an effort to better recruit and retain student representatives, I will be hosting a focus group on why students participate in representative roles. If you are interested in participating, or have feedback surrounding the benefits of being a student representative, let me know!

That treaty governs the relationship between first-nations and non-first-nations citizens. I am thankful for this opportunity for us to meet on this land today. This statement will be included at the front of my report to council until either the time that my term ends, or Council moves to makes a similar statement available for public viewing.

Bonjour again from Quebec! I should be attending next week's Council meeting via Skype. In the meantime, I have a few things to update you folks on.

Acknowledgment of Indigenous land

It has come to my attention that the Students' Union has not recognized that its operations take place on the land of indigenous people. I feel it is important the Students' Union take time to acknowledge the First Peoples who lived – and still live – on these lands. It is important that the Students Union recognize this, just as the University has. When I return from Quebec, I will look to remedy this concern with other concerned members of Council. If anyone is interested in working with me and other councilors to brainstorm the best way for the SU to permanently acknowledge the First Peoples who lived here, please feel free to get in touch.
