1. Open Educational Resource Advocacy Committee

One of my goals, outlined in my platform was to **advocate for affordable classroom materials**. I am extremely pleased to announce that I will be the 2018/19 Chair of the Open Educational Resource (OER) Advocacy Committee! This committee has met previously and is filled with passionate university members; Krysta McNutt, the OER Project Manager and Michelle Brailey, the Digital Initiatives Projects Librarian have been great support.
