2016-15/2a University Tuition and Budget Consultation, Presented by the University Provost and VP Finance & Administration. Sponsored by President Rahman.

Abstract: Each year the University's Provost and VP Finance & Administration presents to Students' Council on the plans for tuition in the upcoming year, as well as what the university budget is looking like. This year the Alberta Government has frozen both tuition and MNIFs for domestic students, and MNIFs for international students, but not international student tuition. Plans for international student tuition will be outlined in the presentation.

The International Students' Association has been active on campus for a few years now, starting in 2013 – 14 when the university proposed the 5% increase to the international differential fee on their tuition. They aim to build community, provide services and advocate for international students at the University of Alberta. They will present some of their

thoughts on the proposed tuition plan by the University and give an overview of the work they are taking on this year.

The Augustana Students' Association (ASA) is a Campus and Faculty Association located in Camrose. The ASA represents around 1,020 students at the Augustana Campus and we collect the Faculty Association Membership Fee to provide for student needs at Augustana. The FAMF accounts for up to 60% of our budget or approximately \$130,000.00. This money, along with revenue generated from services and events, is used for staffing, service delivery, programming, and social events. In accordance with SU By-law, the ASA is bringing forward its proposal to hold a referendum to re-affirm collection of the ASA's Faculty Association Membership Fee which expires on August 31, 2017. We seek approval from SU Council to proceed with the referendum during elections in March of 2017

Hi Council,

I hope the last meeting went well! I'm told that it was a quick meeting, and I apologize for not being able to phone into the meeting. I will certainly be present for this upcoming meeting. The Provost will also be at this meeting to give a presentation on tuition plans, including the tuition hike for international students.

1. CASA Advocacy Week

CASA's Advocacy Week was a huge success, as we were able to field over 160 meetings with MPs, parliamentarians, Senators and government staff. I had the pleasure of advocating to MPs Jeneroux (my own MP), Vaughn, Sorbara, Lake, Calkins, and Schmale, Parliamentary Secretary to the PM (Youth) Schiefke and the staff members within the Ministry of Employment, Labor and Workforce. That last meeting was an incredible experience – the staff members have an impressive knowledge of what post-secondary is capable of and how to support marginalized groups in accessing post-secondary.

I am hoping that we see strong progress on the nine asks that CASA has this year. If anyone would like to read them, they are available here: http://www.advocacyweek.ca/recommendations

Connecting with our partner organizations across the country was an excellent experience as well. We've all been through different experiences at our home institutions, but still find time to unite under these federal priorities outlined at the beginning of the year.

2. Meal Plan

The current edition of the meal plan is going forward to Board Finance and Property Committee for approval. I will be preparing with VP Ghossein in advance of this meeting to talk about how this meal plan will impact students in Lister. I am hoping that we see a change from the current proposed plan because of the negative responses we have heard from students about it.

3. CAUS

As nearly all members of CAUS were present at CASA, we held a formal meeting to discuss some pressing items. In particular, we are wrapping up the hiring of an interim Executive Director while the current one starts mat leave in January.

4. Advocacy on Campus



There was one meeting the executives weren't able to attend around Prayer and Meditation Space in HUB, which General Manager Dumouchel attended on my behalf. I will check in with him to see how the meeting went. VP Banister also attended an APC meeting as the SU representative as I was in Ottawa.

I phoned into the most recent meeting of the Residence Life Task Force, where we worked out timelines now that a third party has been selected to conduct an independent and neutral review of the state of residences.

5. Alumni Council

There was an Alumni Council meeting where we checked in regarding progress on the Council's strategic plan, and outlined some of the major events coming up next semester.

10. Presence and Relevancy

VP Ghossein and I attended the Remembrance Day ceremony for the province in the Butterdome, to lay a wreath and recognize the sacrifices our students made in letting Canada be a free and fair country. Beyond that, I've been spending time on the hill and have brought as much UASU and UAlberta pride to the hill as possible.

Happy day Council,

Feels strange writing this report only 72 hours after seeing everyone! Due to that, just a heads up that this report will be shorter than usual. Otherwise, I hope your last few hours have been good. Mine certainly have, lots of meetings and my moustache is beginning to come in stronger (at least I like to tell myself that). Anyways, onto business!

Chillin for Charity

Wednesday morning I had the pleasure of jumping in Chillin for Charity for the 4th year in a row! A club within the business faculty, Alberta JDC West, hosts the event annually to raise money for the United Way. Students collect donations for a couple weeks and then make a jump into a pool of freezing water. It sounds dreadful for participants, but I've always had a blast. The hot tubs they have to warm up in after may or may not be a large part of that! I jumped with Dean Doucet of the Alberta School of Business, and Andrew Sharman the new VP Facilities and Operations of the University of Alberta.

Deferred Maintenance

Also occurring on Wednesday, the Edmonton Journal, Calgary Herald and Calgary Sun posted articles outlining the extensive backlog of deferred maintenance that both the U of A and U of C are facing. They are \$800 million and \$450 million respectively. Multiple media outlets approached the SU to comment on behalf of students, so I had a few interviews this week. I made the comment that deferred maintenance needs to be prioritized in order to ensure quality of education and experience for students. The last thing we want is for this to reach a crisis point where buildings are being closed. No need to worry, we are not at that point yet, but the government needs to be acting proactively to avoid this. Also notable is this is an issue of government funding as Facilities and Operations within the U of A is prioritizing this, however they simply do not have the funds to tackle it as they'd like. Look to the news, and future reports, for more updates.



Anti-Harassment Campaign in the Gym

Many of you have asked me where this campaign idea has gone and where we currently are in the planning. I finally have an update for you, and it's exciting! Thursday morning I hosted the first meeting of a working group tasked with creating the principals and language around this campaign. The makeup is important stakeholders – Phys-Ed & Rec, The Landing, Graduate Students' Association and the SU. It was an extremely productive meeting and it appears this campaign may expand beyond what was originally envisioned. Instead of simply being in the gym, the campaign will extend to other fitness facilitates in the Van Vilet and other areas on campus. Phys-Ed & Rec also believe this campaign can be a platform for further cultivation of a positive fitness environment for all, not just limited to harassment cases. For example, the campaign could aid in the creation of a community around fitness at the U of A. All in all, the project has officially begun and it's looking even more exciting than I could have imagined. Stay tuned!

Dear Council,

Here is an update on my work in the past week!

COFA Finance

The Council of Faculty Association, Finance and Administration Committee met last week. At this meeting we discussed common goals, financial reporting, as well as the interdisciplinary conference. The meeting had great attendance with representation from 11 faculty associations present!

Department Associations

I have been spending some time working with new department associations, specifically answering questions, providing guidance, and helping strategize advocacy. I think it is very exciting to see more department associations work with their faculty associations to serve their students!

GFC APC

I went to the Academic Planning Committee on President Rahman's behalf last week, as he was in Ottawa lobbying the federal government. It was a very important meeting as we discussed international students tuition. You can read a detailed analysis of the meeting through the Gateway's coverage (https://thegatewayonline.ca/2016/11/intl-undergrad-tuition-increase/). The University is trying to increase international students tuition by 3.02% next year. There is also a \$4,000 "sticker price" increase going to be applied (then immediately removed) for international students in graduate studies. The Students' Union is not in favour of tuition increases and I voted against all proposals to increase student tuition, both in undergraduate and graduate education. If you want more information on this please do not hesitate to ask President Rahman or I.

GFC ASC

I had a very full GFC Academic Standards Committee meeting last week. At the meeting we discussed a number of both promising and concerning changes coming through academic governance which will affect undergraduate students. Namely, a change to the minimum pass grade for nursing students, making a complete 3 or 4 year undergraduate degree mandatory to apply to the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry, and the Faculty of Engineering adjusting the formula for which students can get certain awards and honours. These were only some of the topics among the 16 item agenda (which can be found here if you are interested or want more information http://governance.ualberta.ca/ GeneralFacultiesCouncil/AcademicStandardsCommittee/~/media/Governance/Documents/GO05/ACS/16-17/NO-17/ASC-NO-17-Agenda-and-Documents-revised.pdf). After discussing the various issues with the respective faculty associations, I ended up voting for the nursing proposal, for the engineering proposal, and against the medicine and dentistry proposal. Happy to give a more detailed explanation of how these proposals will affect students in my oral report or in question period.

Mental Health

Advisory Panel on Post-Secondary Mental Health

Lister Meal Plan

This week, I had additional discussions about the meal plan and proposed alternatives to the plan that is offered based on the statistics around how much people spend in lister vs. outside of lister, etc. The students in Lister Centre remain opposed to the proposed meal plan and we will continue to advocate based on student needs.

Residence Life Task Force

In the task force meeting this past week, we met with the proponent that was chosen to conduct the third-party research, Academica, and discussed their research approach, the survey instrument design, project timelines and report formats.

We will be reviewing the proposed survey questions in the upcoming week and letting the different stakeholders know of the timelines around the survey.

Lister Representatives

The Discover Governance Manager and I hired the last Lister Representative; she is representing Mac Hall and was introduced to the team last week.

Student Groups

We (President Rahman, myself, and SU staff (GM, SGS staff, DG staff, etc.) are preparing to have our second meeting with other stakeholders in the recognition and discipline of student groups (the Dean of Students and DOS staff members, the Graduate Students' Association and Campus and Community Rec.). In that meeting, we are going to propose the vision that we have on how students should self-govern and the change in process of recognition that we think is most conducive to developing leadership and citizenship.

Dear Students' Council:

In accordance with Bylaw 100, Section 16 the following written report has been submitted, on-time, to the University of Alberta Students' Union, Students' Council. This report has been completed to permit decisions of Council Administration Committee (CAC) to be approved as outlined in Bylaw 100, Section 16(3).

CAC had many fruitful discussions and was a much more relaxed meeting. We will likely hold a few more such meetings in the future but we do have meetings booked at 5pm before council for the remainder of the semester, so please swing by!

I am happy to say that we were able to make progress on all items submitted, you can see those updates below or view them for yourself within our minutes.

1) Decisions of CAC

Teleconference Town Halls

CAC will be working closely with Councillor Monda to demo teleconference tech. We have set the tentative date of Dec. 6 to demo Adobe Connect through IST, if it can be arranged, and if persons can be available. We will get an update from Councillor Monda on the 22nd so will update council at that time.

Standing Committee Reviews

CAC shall complete their mandated committee reviews no later than Dec. 3 to be submitted to council for Dec. 6. CAC will continue to provide feedback up until that time. CAC Chair has been mandated to ensure that all standing orders to be found in the working drive are up-to-date.

Council Photos

CAC Chair has been mandated to contact the appropriate persons to facilitate Council Photos and compile update report for Nov. 22nd. This item will likely be added as a Special Order.

Council Surveys

CAC deliberated and ultimately decided to facilitate the moving Council Surveys out CAC standing orders and into the duties of Discover Governance. CAC Chair is to facilitate this process and provide a report for Nov. 22nd, at which time CAC may move to strike Council Surveys from its mandate.

Office Hours

CAC discussed at length the viability of mandate, hosted, or facilitated office hours for councillors. CAC came largely to the conclusion that such an item needs further expansion, proper planning, and likely will be outlined in either (1) standing orders (2) as a part of councillors responsibilities as outlined in bylaw (3) as a mandated responsibility of CAC to facilitate. The committee was largely in favor of option (3) and Councillor Farooq was willing to conduct the necessary consultation and proposed outline for CAC standing orders.
